












Puffs: Filmed Live Off-Broadway
















Peter Pan

Famous Children Famous Children

In honor of Mother's Day and Father's Day, we've listed some of the famous mothers and fathers that have played our venues. While you may be familiar with their names, these artists often have equally, if not more, famous children. From acting and singing to modeling and designing, these apples don't fall far from their talented trees.





Marvin Gaye

Margin Gaye was an American singer, songwriter, and record producer who helped shape the sound of Motown in the 1960's, earning the nicknames "Prince of Motown" and "Prince of Soul". In 1973, Gaye released "Let's Get It On," his most successful single for Motown and performed at Scope Arena the following year on August 17, 1974.



Nona Gaye

Nona Gaye is an American singer, former fashion model, actress, and the daughter of Marvin Gaye. She is best known for her work in the *Matrix* films. After being named one of *People Magazine*'s 50 Most Beautiful People in 1993, she was signed to Ford Modeling Agency and became the new face of Armani.



Frank Sinatra

Frank Sinatra was an American singer, actor, and producer who was hailed one of the most popular and influential musical artists of the 20th century. His fame led to the creation of the term "bobby soxers," a word used to describe wildly enthusiastic, teenage female fans of 1940's pop music. He is one of the best-selling music artists of all time, having sold more than 150 million records worldwide. The iconic figure performed at Scope Arena on November 21, 1976.

Nancy Sinatra

Nancy Sinatra is an American singer, actress, and the daughter of Frank Sinatra. She is widely known for her 1965 hit "These Boots Are Made for Walkin'". She made her professional debut at Elvis Presley's airport welcome party on her father's 1960 TV special that celebrated Presley's return from Europe following his military service.





Alan Thicke

Alan Thicke was a Canadian actor, songwriter, game and talk show host, and father of Robin Thicke. He was most known for playing one of TV's most beloved dads Dr. Jason Seaver in *Growing Pains*, citing that he often drew from his own parenting experiences while filming.

Robin Thicke

Robin Thicke is an American singer, songwriter, record producer, dancer, musician and actor. He began his career as a writer and producer for popular artists, cowriting Christina Aguilera's self-titled debut album in 1999. Prior to gaining international fame in 2013 with his single "Blurred Lines", Thicke performed at Chrysler Hall in 2009 and 2010 with Jennifer Hudson and Brian McKnight, respectively.



Brian Wilson

Brian Wilson is an American musician, singer, songwriter, and record producer known for co-founding The Beach Boys. He is often referred to as one of the most innovative songwriters of the 20th century, due to his unorthodox approaches to composition and recording techniques. As a member of The Beach Boys, Wilson performed at Scope Arena four times in the 1970's.



Carnie Wilson

Carnie Wilson is an American singer known for co-founding Wilson Phillips and is the daughter of Brian Wilson. If you've ever seen the film *Bridesmaids*, you'll have seen Wilson Phillips performing "Hold On," the lead single from their 1990 debut album and most successful U.S. single of that year.

Stella McCartney

Stella McCartney OBE is an English fashion designer and the daughter of Paul McCartney and his late wife Linda. One of the fashion industry's leading designers, Stella McCartney has turned her British take on modern femininity and tailoring into a global brand.





Paul McCartney

Sir James Paul McCartney is an English singer, songwriter, musician, and record and film producer who gained worldwide fame as co-lead vocalist and bassist for the Beatles. His songwriting partnership with John Lennon remains the most successful in history. McCartney played Scope Arena with The Beatles for back-to-back concerts on January 14-16, 1977.

Nat King Cole

Nat King Cole was an American singer, jazz pianist, and actor who appeared in films, television, and on Broadway. Cole was the first African-American man to host an American television series called *The Nat King Cole Show*. Cole performed at the Attucks Theatre, then called the Booker T Theatre, with the King Cole Trio in 1947.

Natalie Cole

Natalie Cole was an American singer, songwriter, actress, and daughter of Nat King Cole. At the age of six, she sang on her father's Christmas album *The Magic of Christmas*. Cole rose to worldwide fame in the mid-1970s with iconic hits including "This Will Be", "Inseparable", and "Our Love" and performed at Scope Arena in 1976, 1978, and 1979.







Ozzy Osbourne

Ozzy Osbourne is an English singer, songwriter, and television personality who gained fame as the lead vocalist of the heavy metal band "Black Sabbath". During his time with the band, he adopted the nickname "Prince of Darkness" for his controversial lyrics and performances. In the early 2000's, Osbourne became a reality television star, appearing as himself in *The Osbournes*, alongside his wife and children.

Kelly Osbourne

Kelly Osbourne is an English television personality, actress, singer, model, fashion designer, and daughter of Ozzy and Sharon Osbourne. After her appearance on *The Osbournes*, she began to be noted for her varied and trendy style among fashion commentators, leading her to launch of her own fashion lines.



Mick Jagger

Sir Michael Philip Jagger is an English singer, songwriter, actor and film producer who has gained worldwide fame as the lead singer and one of the founder members of the Rolling Stones. He has been described as one of the most popular and influential frontmen in the history of rock and roll. Jagger played Scope Arena with The Rolling Stones on July 5, 1972.



Georgia May Jagger

Georgia May Jagger is an English fashion model, designer, and the daughter of Mick Jagger and supermodel Jerry Hall. Representing British fashion, Jagger took part in the 2012 Summer Olympics closing ceremony and has represented English brands from Rimmel to Mulberry.



Steven Tyler

Steven Tyler is an American singer, songwriter, musician, actor, and former television personality who is best known as the lead singer of Aerosmith. He has been nicknamed the "Demon of Screamin'" due to his wide vocal range signature high pitched screams. Tyler played Scope Arena with Aerosmith in 1975 and 1976.



Liv Tyler

Liv Tyler is an American actress, producer, singer, former model, and is the daughter of Steven Tyler. She is best known for her work in the *Lord of the Rings* film trilogy, but she first became known to television audiences when she appeared in the music video for Aerosmith's 1993 song "Crazy".

"We look forward to a Broadway in Norfolk girls' night out every year. It's a tradition that I know my daughters will one day pass on to their children."




WATTERSON FAMILY NORFOLK, VA



Chicken Hash

Recipe courtesy of Guy Fieri

- 4 ounces olive oil, divided
- 2 red onions, diced
- 4 cloves garlic, thinly sliced
- 1 red bell pepper, julienned
- 1 green bell pepper, julienned
- 2 jalapeños, seeded and diced
- 2 pounds chicken thighs, with bone and skin
- 6 ounces beer
- 4 ounces water
- 1 lime, juiced
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 2 teaspoons freshly ground black pepper
- 2 pounds red potatoes, very thinly sliced
- 1/2 cup Roma tomatoes, diced, for garnish
- 1/2 cup queso fresco, for garnish
- In medium sauté pan, add 2 ounces olive oil, onions, garlic, and peppers and sauté until translucent. Add chicken and brown on all sides. Remove half of the onion and pepper mixture.
- Continue to cook chicken and deglaze with beer, water, and lime juice, salt, and pepper, let simmer for 45 minutes until chicken begins to fall off the bone. Remove chicken, let cool. Remove bone and remaining skin, and shred with forks.
- 3. In same sauté pan, reduce mixture until thick. Remove mixture from the pan, add the remaining 2 ounces oil and potatoes and fry potatoes until crispy. Add onion and pepper mixture and shredded chicken. Press mixture together as it cooks and form into 1/2-inch cake. Flip over to brown both sides.
- 4. Top with diced tomatoes and queso fresco.

Crunch Crazy Asparagus Spears

Recipe courtesy of Guy Fieri

- 1 pound medium asparagus (about 20 spears)
- 2 egg whites
- Kosher salt and freshly cracked black pepper
- 1 tablespoon mayonnaise
- 2 cups panko breadcrumbs
- 1/2 cup grated Parmesan
- 1 teaspoon Italian seasoning
- 1 teaspoon paprika
- Extra-virgin olive oil
- 1. Preheat the oven to 425° F.
- Prepare the asparagus by trimming off the tough woody stem.
- Set up a breading station by whipping the egg whites and mayonnaise together (the mayonnaise helps the whites stick to the asparagus). Sprinkle with some salt and pepper.
- 4. In a separate, dish add the panko, Parmesan, Italian seasoning and paprika. Sprinkle with salt and pepper and mix. Dip each asparagus spear in the egg wash and then coat evenly in the seasoned panko breadcrumbs. Place the spears on a wire rack over a baking sheet and lightly drizzle with some olive oil (this will help them crisp up).
- 5. Bake until golden and crispy, 15 to 17 minutes. Serve immediately.



Lemon Ricotta Fritters with Quick Berry Jam

- Canola oil, for frying
- ¾ cup all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1 teaspoon grated lemon zest
- ¼ teaspoon fine sea salt
- 1 cup whole milk ricotta
- 2 large eggs
- 3 tablespoons granulated sugar
- 1½ teaspoons pure vanilla extract
- Confectioner's sugar

Lemon Ricotta Fritters

- Heat 2 inches of canola oil in a large, wide, heavy saucepan until it reaches 370° F on a deep-fry thermometer.
- Whisk together the flour, baking powder, lemon zest, and salt in a bowl. Whisk together the ricotta, eggs, granulated sugar, and vanilla in another bowl. Whisk the ricotta mixture into the flour mixture.
- 3. Working in batches, gently drop in tablespoons of batter and fry, turning occasionally, until deep golden, about 3 minutes per batch. Transfer with a slotted spoon to paper towels to drain. Dust generously with confectioner's sugar and serve with the berry jam.

Quick Berry Jam

- 1 pound fresh strawberries, tops cut off and halved
- 1/2 pint blackberries
- 1/2 pint raspberries
- 1/2 to 3/4 cup sugar, depending on sweetness
- 1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice
- Combine the berries and 1/2 cup of the sugar in a bowl and coarsely mash with a potato masher. Let the berries sit at room temperature for 15 minutes to allow the berries to release some of their juice. Taste for desired sweetness and add remaining sugar if necessary. Transfer berries to a medium saucepan, add lemon juice and cook until thickened, about 5 minutes. Transfer to a bowl, cover and refrigerate until chilled or serve immediately: transfer to a bowl and set the bowl over an ice bath, stirring until iam is cooled.





- 1. Put the flour, 1 tablespoon sugar and ½ teaspoon salt in the bowl of a food processor and pulse to combine. Add the butter and pulse just until the mixture resembles a coarse meal. Stream in the ice water and pulse again to incorporate. Pinch the dough with your fingers to test; it should hold together without being sticky. Turn it out onto a piece of plastic wrap and form into a disk. Refrigerate until firm, about 1 hour.
- 2. A few minutes before the dough is ready, slice the plums into ½-inch thick pieces. Put 2 tablespoons sugar, the tapioca starch, a pinch of salt and the lemon zest in a large bowl. Gently toss the plums in the sugar mixture to coat. Transfer the plums to a strainer and set the strainer over the bowl to catch any juices that run out. Reserve the juices.
- 3. Position a rack in the center of the oven and preheat the oven to 375° F. Roll out the dough into a 1/4-inch thick disk and transfer to a parchment-lined baking sheet. Very lightly dust the bottom of the crust with more tapioca starch. Start laying the plum slices on their sides in a circular pattern with their edges touching or slightly overlapping; leave about a 1½-inch border around the edge of the dough. Continue lining the inside of the circle with more plums until the surface is covered. Fold the edges of the dough around the plums, folding and pinching the dough as needed.
- 4. Brush the outer edges of the dough with cream. Sprinkle the top of the plums and the edge of the dough with ½ teaspoon more sugar.
- 5. Bake until the crust is lightly browned, and the juice of the plums are sizzling, about 45 minutes. If the plums look dry when you remove the tart, brush the fruit with a very small amount of the reserved juices. Let cool. Serve sliced into wedges with the ice cream, if desired.

Blackberry-Bourbon Iced Tea

Recipe courtesy of **Bobby Flay**

- 3 cups fresh blackberries
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh mint, plus mint sprigs for garnish
- 6 good-quality black tea bags
- Good-quality bourbon, to taste
- 1. Combine the blackberries, sugar and chopped mint in a large bowl and mash with a potato masher or wooden spoon; let sit while making the tea.
- 2. While the blackberries are macerating, bring 11/2 quarts cold water to a boil in a medium saucepan. Remove from the heat, add the tea bags and let steep for about 3 minutes. Remove the tea bags and pour the tea over the blackberry mixture. Let the mixture sit at room temperature for at least 1 hour to let the flavors meld.
- 3. Pour the mixture through a strainer into a pitcher, pressing on the solids. Cover and refrigerate until cold, at least 2 hours. (You can also pour the mixture into a bowl set over an ice bath to cool it faster.)
- 4. Serve the blackberry tea over ice in tall glasses and float a shot of bourbon on top of each.
 Garnish with fresh mint sprigs (like a mint julep).

Spicy Citrus Bloody Mary

Recipe courtesy of Bobby Flay

- 2 to 3 cups ice
- 1 lemon, cut into wedges
- 1 lime, cut into wedges
- 1 tablespoon horseradish, drained
- 1 jalapeño pepper, minced
- Pinch salt
- 2 cups vodka
- 3 cups tomato juice
- 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce

 Muddle ice, lemon wedges, lime wedges, horseradish, jalapeño, and salt in the bottom of a pitcher. Add vodka, tomato juice, and Worcestershire and stir to combine. Refrigerate if not serving immediately or pour into glasses over ice and serve.






