








SEATING HOLD		THE AUDITORIUM WHERE THE AUDIENCE SITS AS THEY WATCH THE SHOW
SWING		BEFORE OR AFTER A SHOW, THE CAST WILL COME BACK ON STAGE FOR AN INFORMAL DISCUSSION WITH THE AUDIENCE
TALK BACK		THE RIGHT SIDE OF THE STAGE FROM THE ACTOR'S PERSPECTIVE






TAYLOR: Remember that last week we found a school of tiny fish. They were very tasty. Croak-croak.
